## SEASONAL TRAPPING: Helpful Solutions

 Leave the family alone for a few weeks until the babies are mobile. The mother will then naturally take them from the den site out to learn how to be their species.




 After they have departed you can then take measures to seal up, cap the chimney or fill in the den location to make it uninhabitable.




 Hardware cloth can be buried below the groundline around porches, decks, and sheds to prevent woodchucks, skunks, fox, and opossums from burrowing underneath and taking up residency.



 Closing holes in the attic will prevent bats, raccoons, and squirrels from entering.

 Humane traps must be checked every 12 hours and not left out in the extreme environmental conditions such as direct sunlight, rain, wind or snow.
